<u>Greeting</u>

The Lord be with all people on earth as we meet remotely in the name of Jesus, and give God glory.

Prayer of Preparation

Loving God, we set aside this time to worship you. Help us to pray to you in faith, to sing your praise with gratitude, and to read and absorb your word with eagerness; and to give our lives to your will on earth. Amen.

Confession

God loved the world so much that he sent Jesus to repair our relationship with God, to offer us forgiveness for the things we have done, either knowingly or unknowingly that have gone against the Way of Love.



In a moments silence we let God remind us of anything we need to confess.

Lord, for times we have misused your gifts of creation....*pause* For the times we have been unkind in what we have said or done....*pause* For times we have seen others suffering and not tried to help....*pause* For the times we have not trusted you to be there for us....*pause* Jesus, through your love, forgive us, in your mercy free us and by your power heal us.

<u>Absolution</u>

God, who is Love forgives us and sets us free. We are renewed and made whole by the sacrifice of Jesus. Amen. <u>Collect for the 5th Sunday of Easter</u> Risen Christ, your wounds declare your love for the world and the wonder of your risen life: Give us compassion and courage to risk ourselves for those we serve, to the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Bible Readings: Genesis 8:1-19 / Acts 7:55-60 / John 14:1-14

Reflection

Well...the first thing that comes to me this week from our readings is the Gospel of John chapter 14, and it's significance for funerals – maybe because I have a few booked to do. Sorry to begin on what might seem like a negative note, but, after all there are an awful lot of funerals happening around the world at the moment. This passage from John's Gospel is widely used at funerals because it says several things to the grieving, and for the deceased.

Firstly, of course, it says: 'Don't let your hearts be troubled.' We read the New Living Translation, but, here are a couple of alternative translations:

"Don't worry or surrender to your fear." (The Passion Translation) "Don't let this throw you." (The Message) "Do not be worried and upset." (Good News Bible)

Because of all that Jesus has done, even rising from the dead, we need not be troubled, afraid, worried, thrown or upset. And yet, I will admit that I have been thrown a bit by what is happening around the world at the moment. However, because of Jesus and my belief in him, I can quickly come back to a place of peace because, although like everyone else, I simply don't know how things will progress in the coming months, I know Jesus is still with us and *for* us.

Jesus had just said his final farewell to his disciples (in chapter 13) – told them to love each other and that their love for one another would prove to the world that they were his followers. That message never changes! John records Jesus having been 'troubled' three times himself (11:33, 12:27, 13:21), but his confidence in God's power made it possible for him to face all that he had to endure.

Having commanded them to love, Jesus now tells them to trust. "Trust in God, trust also in me." Trust in God, who's power raised Jesus from the dead, trust in God who says simply 'love each other.' Then...you will be with me when the time is right. That's the kind of reassurance we need at a funeral. We can't be with Jesus, physically right now, but one day we will. And we can know this to be true because Jesus is The Truth. (verse 6)

And then the flood recedes....As we turn to the reading from Genesis we see further that we can trust in God. Our God is gracious and this flood too will pass, the flood waters of this pandemic will pass – and leave humanity with the opportunity for a fresh start. A chance to make different, better choices for the common good, for the good of the natural world, for wildlife and farm animals and key workers: choices motivated by love alone. <u>The Extending of Peace</u> Let us put aside all that troubles us and receive, into our hearts, the peace of God. The peace of the Lord be always with us. *Pause for a moment to extend peace to our fellowship at Keston Church.....*

Lord Jesus, let us receive the peace that your give. Peace that the world and all distractions and complexities cannot give. The peace of Christ be always with us and all peoples. *Pause for a moment to extend peace to all people....*

Pray as the Spirit leads you

For the world, the church, our community – for peace, comfort, compassion, healing, joy and hope – inspired by love.
