#### <u>Greeting</u>

The Father calls us closer, the Son offers us redemption the Spirit fills us with love and truth. The Lord be with us – and with all God has created. Amen.

# Say in silence or aloud....

5 Therefore, since I have been made right in God's sight by faith, I have peace with God because of what Jesus Christ our Lord has done for ME.<sup>2</sup> Because of my faith, Christ has brought ME into this place of undeserved privilege where I now stand, and I confidently and joyfully look forward to sharing God's glory.

<sup>3</sup> I can rejoice, too, when I run into problems and trials, for I know that they help ME develop endurance. <sup>4</sup> And endurance develops strength of character, and character strengthens my confident hope of salvation. <sup>5</sup> And this hope will not lead to disappointment. For I know how dearly God loves ME, because he has given ME the Holy Spirit to fill my heart with his love.

<sup>6</sup> When I was utterly helpless, Christ came at just the right time and died for ME, a sinner. <sup>7</sup> Now, most people would not be willing to die for an upright person, though someone might perhaps be willing to die for a person who is especially good. <sup>8</sup> But God showed his great love for ME by sending Christ to die for ME while I was still a sinner.

# **Reflection**

This week I am again struck by the words in the Collect – I know these prayers have been well thought through, and used for years – and so they seem to sum up what the message is for us this week.

'Help us to keep the law of love.'

Just imagine if it was actually the law that we should love each other, love all people, act in love in everything in our everyday lives. Of course the law does reflect the principles of the Bible and the Ten Commandments of God; and you could say that acting within the law is living the way of love. But, is that the same as having a law that says we MUST act, all the time, in the way of love?

Wrapped up in our three readings today is the reminder of the gift of faith that we have, and all that we have been given through Jesus: peace, privilege, confidence, a share in God's glory, strength of character and hope. We are redeemed sinners – saved and made new! And all these things simply because God loves us.

It's good for us to be reminded of Sarah who scoffed at the thought of God doing the impossible – allowing her to be pregnant when she and Abraham were so old. Our faith means that we do <u>believe</u> the things we cannot yet see, because we know that God loves us so much that wherever possible, when it is the best things for us, God gives us good gifts. God answers prayer!

It is with all this knowledge of God's love alive within us that we receive the words of Jesus: "The harvest is great, but the workers are few. So pray to the Lord of the harvest – ask for more workers to be send into the fields." Because we know we are loved we are able to love others – to keep the law of love.

I'm reminded of that Boney M song, recorded in 1978 – By The Rivers of Babylon. It was based on Psalm 137, and in it says: "How can we sing the Lord's song in a strange land?" God's people, exiled, find themselves in a strange land. How can we go out as workers for the Lord, willing to gather in the harvest, in this 'strange land' – of pandemic and lockdown, we currently find ourselves in? How might we gather more workers – make more disciples for the Lord? We can begin by showing love, and I know we are doing that. Making a phone call, sending a note, doing a bit of shopping etc.

I am doing a Zoom Conference on that this week – so I may pass on some ideas next week!

One very simple thing we can do to share the love of God, is let people know we are praying – you could put the poster that came to you this week of the 'Praying Hands' in your window! I have, over the years, found it amazing that people are very appreciative of being prayed for. Sometimes God may gift us with other opportunities to share the peace or reassurance we have gained through our faith – that also, I'm sure, would be much appreciated in these strange times.

Remember you are loved by God, remember God can do the impossible, remember all you have in Christ Jesus – read again through this week those verses from Romans we said earlier; and remember, above all, to keep the 'law of love.' Amen.

<u>Share the peace of God with the world</u> God wants us to set aside all that worries and concerns us and to receive into our hearts the gift of peace. The peace of the triune God fill our hearts and bring peace to the world.

Offer the gift of peace to friends, family, community and world...
