Reflection

This week I am giving you lots of 'food for thought' – this reflection covers the next two weeks. Please re-read the Bible passages – maybe use 'Lectio Divina' (prayerful, meditative reading of Scripture)

Author Melissa Hill wrote: "Bread – like real love – took time, cultivation, strong loving hands and patience. It lived, rising and growing to fruition only under the most perfect circumstances." We need the 'Bread of Life' that Jesus gives – spend time on it so it lives in you and bears fruit.

Our faith in God will sustain us – 'Lord, deepen our faith.' We place our trust in God for this wounded world – and this world and its peoples are very much wounded right now! And, there is one thing that very much contributes to that woundedness – but we don't really like to talk about it – it is sin. Let's say from the beginning that sin is anything that goes against God's way, the way of love.

Do we love other people – make sure they are clothed, fed and homed? Do we love the environment – make sure rubbish, especially plastics, are disposed of safely? Do we love animals – provide for their needs, keep them in good conditions, kill them humanely? I'm going to suggest (maybe controversially) that if we say 'no' to any of these, then we sin.

This is a time for us to challenge ourselves to stay clear of world systems that are sinful. We may not have even thought that our attitudes to consuming, what we consume and what damage to people, communities or the environment our own consuming has, are actually sinful – going against that responsibility God gave us right back in the Garden of Eden, to care for all creation.

This is a time to speak out, an opportunity to campaign for fairer, better, compassionate, loving systems. Jesus says: "What I whisper in your ear, shout from the housetops for all to hear!" What might Jesus be whispering in your ear that you can shout about – and bring about change in.

During the conference (I attended on Zoom) this week on 'Covid19 – the impact on our mission and ministry' we were made aware of the work of Tearfund. They campaign for a fairer world and have ways for us all to contribute to speaking out for change by signing various petitions. Tearfund also have an amazing campaign called – Reboot Campaign They suggest 5 steps to a better world. The opportunity to email Boris Johnson ahead of Britain hosting the G7 and COP26 in 2021 – which I have done!

The coronavirus crisis has changed the way we see the world. It's reminded us of the fragility of life and exposed deep inequalities in society. As churches and communities adapt to find new ways to be a light in the darkness, many are reimagining what life could be like.

Together, we can protect those most vulnerable in this crisis, and reboot the economy in a fair, sustainable way. We're calling for a world that allows every person to flourish – along with all of creation.

This is a once-in-a-generation opportunity to build a better reality together. You have a vital role to play in shaping this future. Will you join us in calling for change?

I hope you have enough food for thought for the next couple of weeks – maybe you could tell me how you think we, as a church, we can contribute to making this world better, fairer and brighter for all, going forward........
